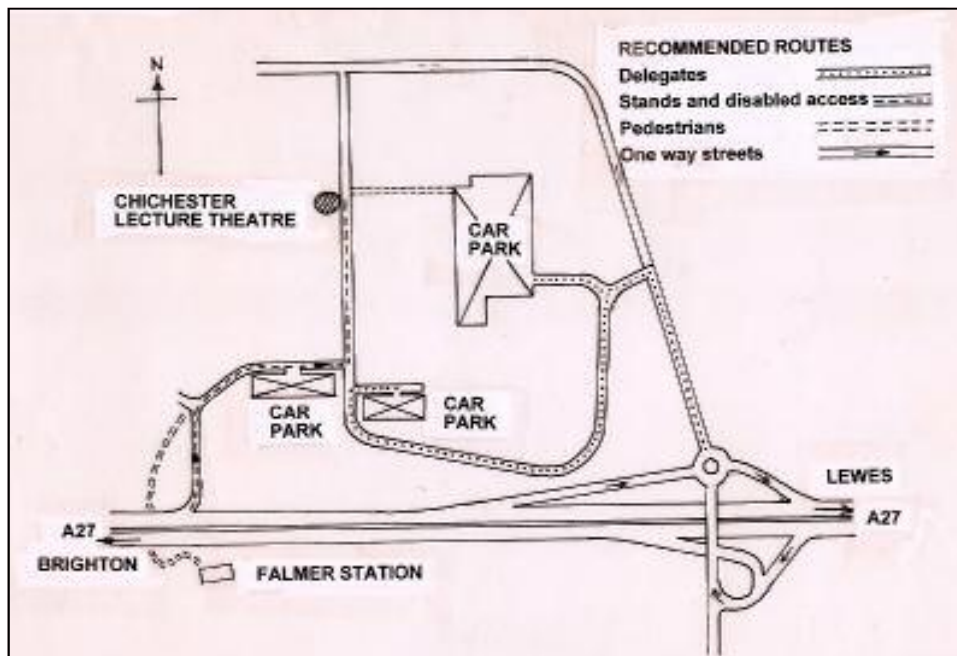


Travel and Parking

Sussex University can be easily accessed by public transport and car. Falmer Railway Station is next to the University. It is on the Brighton-Lewes line with trains every 20 min. The No.25 local buses run from Brighton town centre into the campus. If travelling by car the University is on the A27 between Brighton and Lewes. Parking is free.
